American Society of Neuroimaging Response to:

"Higher Use of Advanced Imaging Services by Providers Who Self-Refer Costing Medicare Millions"

- A 2012 GAO report commissioned by Sens. Max Baucus (D-Mont.) and Chuck Grassley (R-Iowa), and Reps. Henry Waxman (D-Calif.), Sander Levin (D-Mich.), and Pete Stark (D-Calif.).
 - GAO uses a deficient methodology ¹ which grossly misrepresents utilization and costs ^{1,2}
 - The report *does not* show that self-referring providers use more imaging ^{1,2}
 - The Hospital-ER complex a nexus of high cost healthcare ^{3,4} is excluded by GAO
 - Non-hospital MRI & CT = ½ % of total spending, and decreasing
 - Self-referred MRI & CT = $\frac{1}{6}$ % of total spending, and decreasing
 - Hospital-based MRI & CT = 4 % of total spending ², and growing ^{3,4}
 - Hospital –based imaging is very costly, for no added benefit ^{3,4}
 - Self-referring physicians compete with the Hospital, improve access, and reduce costs
 - Implementing GAO recommendations would *increase* Medicare spending by billions ²
